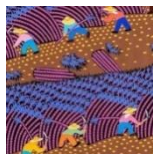

Visitors to the newest College of the Canyons Gallery 206 exhibition, "Vibrant Bounty: Chinese Folk Art from the Shaanxi Region," will be carried away to

Shaanxi Province, one of the cradles of Chinese civilization, for a broader understanding and appreciation for another culture. The public will not want to miss the priceless artifacts and paintings that tell the stories of a far away, but not altogether different, people.

"With this exhibition, we can reach beyond our region and promote the value and understanding of art in an international context," said Pamela Lewis, director of the COC Art Gallery.

The artifacts included in this collection depict Chinese rural life and show traditional Shaanxi customs. They range from children's clothing and toys to New Year's prints and decorative household items, often embroidered with lucky figures and animals.

A public reception will be held on February 13 from 3 to 5 p.m.

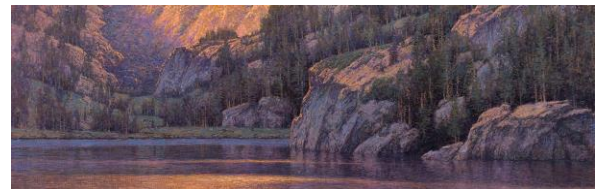
